COMMUNITY

Auburn is located in the beautiful Finger Lakes Region of New York State, 25 miles west of Syracuse. The city of 27,000 is at the northern tip of Owasco Lake and is the county seat of Cayuga County. The Auburn Enlarged City School District serves both Auburn and the municipalities of Fleming, Sennett, and Owasco, with a total district population of about 37,000. The district provides an excellent educational program for 4,600 full-time students as well as other programs.

Rich in history, Auburn has been the home of many famous persons, including former Secretary of State William H. Seward, freedom fighter Harriet Tubman, and the father of talking pictures, Theodore Case.

SCHOOL

Auburn High School serves a total school population of approximately 1,400 students in grades 9-12. The students are assigned alphabetically to one of six counselors and one of three assistant principals. Students remain with the same school counselor and assistant principal throughout their high school careers in order to provide continuity for students and their families.

GRADUATION CREDITS

Each student is required to earn 22 credits for graduation from Auburn High School.

CURRICULUM

The program at Auburn High School is designed to meet the needs of all students regardless of their academic ability or future plans. Courses for college credits or advanced standing are offered through Cayuga Community College (CCC), Missouri University of Science & Technology (MST), Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT), and Syracuse University (SUPA), and the Advanced Placement (AP) Program. Students may enroll in our college preparatory Regents level program (R), our general academic program, and/or a variety of vocational and occupational programs designed to help prepare them for the world of work. E, AP, RIT, SUPA, MST and CCC level course grades are **weighted** (1.05) when calculating the student's grade point average. Capable students may begin earning high school credits in middle school through an accelerated program in math, language, science, and/or art.

INSTRUCTIONAL LEVELS

Several levels of instruction are offered at Auburn High School to meet the needs of all students. The level and code designations are:

AP	Advanced Placement
E	Enriched (Honors)
R	Academic (Regents)

General courses are either designated as such or have no designation. The level of each course is identified by the letter that follows the name: e.g.: English 10E, English 10R.

The criteria used in placing students in the instructional levels are classroom performance, counselor and teacher recommendation, and standardized test scores.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Advanced Placement: English, Calculus, Biology, US History, Government, World History, Chemistry

Enriched (Honors) Courses: English 9E, 10E, 11E; Geometry E; Algebra 2/Trig E; Biology E; Chemistry E; and Physics E.

College Credit Program: CCC: American History, Art, Biology 208; Conservation, Calculus, Microcomputer Application Software, English 101 & 102, Wellness, Health, Pre-Calculus, Principles of Accounting, Principles of Business, Spanish 103, Spanish 104, Italian 103. **Students enrolled in the BOCES New Visions Programs also earn college credits from CCC.**
RIT: Intro to Engineering Design/DDP; Principles of Engineering, Digital Electronics, Civil Engineering & Architecture, Engineering Design & Development. **Syracuse Univ.:** SUPA Economics, **MST:** Principals of Biomedical Sciences

Grading Policy

A traditional numerical grading system is used with a minimum passing grade of 65%. Final averages are computed as follows:

Full Year Courses: 75% = average of the 6 marking periods and 25% = final exam.

Semester Courses: 75% = average of the 3 marking periods and 25% = final exam.

**Some courses utilize portfolio assessment in the place of a final exam.

GPA/Rank in Class

Grade point average and rank are computed after the 6th semester using all courses for which a numerical average is recorded. Both GPA and Rank in Class are **weighted**. When calculating rank, the weighting formula adds 5% to the final average in E, AP & college credit classes.
